



NCCC SCHOLARSHIP

Requirements/Rules of the Scholarship

The NCCC Scholarship will be given for the purpose of assisting a person with an NCCC affiliation in the continuation of his/her formal education. Any continuing education program is acceptable – any school or any college have any curriculum. However, some preference will be given to high school seniors and recent high school graduates who wish to attend college. The period of the award will be for one year, and previous award winners will be eligible.

No financial need requirement is to be established.

The Applicant

The applicant for the NCCC Scholarship must meet the following requirements:

- a) a close involvement with the NCCC for a minimum period of three (3) years either as an NCCC member or a legal member of the immediate family of an NCCC member—child or grandchild.
- b) a high school diploma or the anticipation of a high school diploma before the time that the scholarship is to be awarded. A copy of the diploma must be provided before an award can be presented.
- c) college students must submit a copy of their college transcripts.
- d) an academic standing in high school in the upper third of the high school graduating class.
- e) a record of involvement in some extra curricular activities in high school or college.
- f) a letter of acceptance from the institution for which the scholarship is to be awarded.
- g) a brief 300 word essay included with the application outlining the applicant's reasons for wanting the scholarship and the applicant's career goals.
- h) Three letters of recommendation from persons who are qualified to evaluate the applicant's potential. The "**Recommendation for NCCC Scholarship**" form is to be used when asking for the recommendations.

Although the NCCC Scholarship is an award of money which does not necessarily need to be repaid, it would be appreciated if the recipient would consider contributing to the NCCC Scholarship Fund in some future time following the completion of his/her education.
