NEW REGIONS FOR 1964

In an attempt to promote inter-club cooperation and participation in events, a revised list of areas comprising the regions of the National Council of Corvette Clubs is herein presented.

It is our belief that through inter-club activities within a region we can benefit the separate clubs, unify the clubs within a geographical area and at the same time strengthen the National Council.

The National Council has, with only limited success, attempted to instill a common spirit or esprit-de-corps within the National organization. The limited success is due in part to everyone's natural loyalty to their home club, and the difficulty in maintaining communications over great distances.

We do not propose that you transfer even a small part of your loyalty from your club to the National. This would defeat the purpose of the Council, which is to help the local clubs, but we do think that by combining the interests and abilities of separate clubs everyone can benefit.

It will be possible to combine the schedule of events of the clubs within a region. This will enable individual clubs to have a more diversified choice of events without driving across the country. In addition, it will enable a club's members to enjoy more high quality events without the necessity of organizing and sponsoring them personally. This would also increase the number of participants at an event, which always makes it a better event and often makes the difference between operating at a profit or a loss.

The grouping of clubs in the list below is on reasonable driving distances. We are proposing this list as a starting point. We welcome your suggestions and comments. This thing will not work at all without your help. Even if you think it is not a workable system, please tell us your opinions and suggestions.

The Creole Corvette Club, Corvette Club of Tennessee, and the San Jacinto Corvette Clubs are the only N.C.C.C. Clubs in their areas. Until additional clubs in these areas join the National Council, no attempt will be made to establish regions in those areas.

A regional director will be selected to coordinate activities within his region. His duties will include:

1. Coordinate schedules of events of all clubs within the region.
2. Assist in obtaining N.C.C.C. sanction for an event.
3. Tabulate and forward N.C.C.C. competition points earned in the region.
4. Assist in National events such as the convention and the Elkhart Lake event.
5. Submit scheduled events in the region to Blue Bars as soon as possible, for publishing.
